approved January 4, 2021 is hereby amended, amending Sec. 40-420.02.B to allow commercial						
child care centers as special land use, subject to Sec. 40-518, in the I – Industrial District.						
Section 2. The amendment will amend the table of land uses in Sec. 40-402.01, by including						
commercial child care centers as a special land use in the Industrial District.						
Section 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after its adoption or upon its publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the City, whichever occurs later.
